

And sings the tune without the words,


And never stops at all,

Alan Kennedy

My name's Alan Kennedy -I am a happy resident of Navorina, this is a short story on my life as a newspaper printer. Unfortunately, my wife passed away in 1967, just short of her 26 birthdays, I have two daughters and a son, eight grandchildren, 17 great grandchildren and 1 great great grandson. I finished my intermediate exam November 13, 1952, and started my apprenticeship the next day as a newspaper employee. The apprenticeships in those days lasted six years, I started out as a hand and machine compositor. The firm at Wyong Advocate brought a third linotype, which I taught myself to work. After 10 and half years, I applied for a job at the Wagga Wagga Daily Advertiser. "I spent quite some time setting up racing. While there I worked with Geoff Dixon, who later became CEO of Qantas, a fellow by the name of Grahame Morris, who was PM John Howard news secretary and a reporter Adam Walters, who is now employed by Sky Fox news. I later went from racing operator to racing subeditor under Michael McCormack, later to become Australian Deputy Prime Minister, under PM Scott Morrison.
