Spotlight



Joan Campbell – Interview by Alan Kennedy and Joan's family.

Joan was born on the 5th of February 1924 in Kyabram to parents Hazel and Jim Snowball. She grew up on a farm with her big brother Jack where her parents were orchardists. Joan attended the Tongala East public school then went to the Echuca Tech to study dress making and later the Berry Street children's home where she was a mothercraft nurse. When she was 21, she married Sid Campbell a dairy farmer, after the birth of their first child they moved to their farm near Blighty called 'Robec'.

While Sid built the farm into a productive irrigation property Joan cared for their 4 children using her dress making skills to make their children's clothes and her knowledge to establish a garden with a large vegetable plot and orchard.

Joan's shelves in the pantry were always full of fruit and vegetables she had preserved. Joan and Sid were active in their community and enjoyed social events in local halls where they loved to dance. They took a break each year to go on holiday to the beach.

In 1959 Joan and Sid bought 'Nullum' a dry farming property where they ran sheep. Joan continued to use her skills to look after the family and the gardens. The farm hands and shearers on both farms appreciated Joan's cooking. 'Nullum' is on the Edward river and the family enjoyed times swimming and fishing together and with friends and city family members who came to stay. This was a sad time for Joan and Sid because the children had to go away to boarding school due to the isolation of the property.

In 1965 Joan and Sid bought a block of land on the river in Deniliquin and built their house which Joan still owns. During this next phase in their lives, Joan became the part owner of a dress shop which they named Wynjay. Joan sold her share in the shop in the early 1970's when Sid became ill. Sid and Joan enjoyed travelling and explored many parts of Australia which Joan continued to do after Sid's death in 1989.

Joan saw more of Australia as well as New Zealand and a trip to Great Britain with her eldest daughter Barbara where they explored England and Scotland and then went on to Denmark where one of her grandchildren was living.

Joan was a very confident driver making the trip to Nambour in Queensland where her daughter Anne was living, on many occasions often taking some of her grandchildren. She was still driving into her 90's. Joan is still able to enjoy her view of the river from her chair in the lounge room when she comes home for her Saturday mornings with her family. Joan has 4 children, 13 grandchildren and 20 great grandchildren. MARDI GRAS
